Education to Employment Brokers – MSD and MOE

In September 2019 Cabinet agreed to fund a new education-to-employment (E2E) brokerage service, one of four approved initiatives proposed by the Ministry of Education.

The service aims to raise the profile of Vocational Opportunities and strengthen the pipeline between employers and students. Recent research initiated by MSD, from the Employers and Manufacturers Association (EMA), shows that only 18% of businesses have links with schools.

Twenty-five vocational brokers have been employed across NZ. They are responsible for building strong local relationships and liaising between interested schools and employers in their region to highlight local trades and vocational opportunities.

The service was rolled out early April but was put on hold due to Covid-19. The Vocational Coordinators have almost all been recruited now and have been employed for the next two years.

MSD would like to understand students' awareness and interest in vocational opportunities or university pathways before the programme: Education to Employment is launched.

It would be useful to have as many senior students complete this survey as possible so this programme can be developed to meet student needs. The link to send out to students is Students Can opt into a draw to win one of four \$250 prezzie vouchers.

The research is important to enable MSD to track and assess if this programme has a positive impact on our students and our communities. This will help guide if the programme is to be extended or not. The first research survey will provide baseline results that will be used to determine effectiveness at the end of the two years.

Virtual Careers Expo

NZ Wide Careers Expo

Thank you those that supported the Virtual Careers Expo. Over the two days, there were 5601 users registered and 3554 unique visitors that went through the platform. Per capita, that works out to be a higher turnout than the

Australian event. There were some issues with registration and logging on and, most people agree it does not replace the benefits of face to face Career Expo and Roadshows. For many in the regions it was an opportunity for students, especially Year 12, to explore some options and connect with different tertiary providers.

The **NZ Careers Expos** were postponed but will run as planned in Term 3.

Ministry of Education Update

Feedback has been forwarded to the Ministry of Education regarding the New Zealand Curriculum Guidelines, thank you to those who have submitted feedback. Recommendations have been made to the Ministry by both CATE and CDANZ. Both organisations emphasise the importance of a per capita approach for career education staffing based on school rolls to provide consistency of career education — reiterating Minister Hipkins at the 2019 CATE conference in Napier where he stated, the quality of career education a student has should not depend on which school they attend". Thank you to those who completed the Career Advisor to Student ratio survey — this the Ministry an understanding of what is happening in schools currently. Previously assumptions have been made but without data. Out of 500 secondary schools (including area schools), 176 schools (35.2%) responded to the survey.

Results show that the majority of the Career Advisors surveyed believe I x Full time Career Advisor (25 student contact hours) per 500 -750 students is a fair allocation but as you can see, this is not the current reality.

Results show: -

77% of schools have a ratio higher than 1 Career Advisor per 750

This includes 49% having an equivalent ratio of 1 Career Advisor per 1500 students or higher

Only 23% fall within the range CATE members believe is fair.

Out of the 176 surveyed - 150 are registered teachers and 26 are non-teaching staff.

Career Qualifications of Respondents

We will continue to advocate that the New Zealand Career Guidelines can only be achieved if we have a fair time allowance and space within the curriculum to deliver effective career education.
